

Denis Marquis, ing.

Denis is a professional engineer and retired from the Bell family in 2003, after some 30 years of service. He held numerous middle management level positions with Bell and Télébec throughout his career, mainly in the Network Provisioning (NP) area, and was General Manager – NP Support at Bell at the time of his retirement. After several development moves in Québec City, Ottawa and eventually Montréal, he was transferred to Télébec from 1990 to 1996 and held a few general manager/vice president positions with a wide array of experience, such as overall Network Planning & Provisioning, Supply Chain Management (warehouse, vehicles and buildings) and Regulatory Matters. Upon his return to Bell in 1996 until his retirement, he was mostly involved in the implementation of major NP projects like a plug-in provisioning system, as well as a new generation of an outside plant provisioning tool called NetworkX. In 2000, he was also offered a short term assignment (4 months) in Caracas, Venezuela for BCI, with a new start-up company called Genesis Telecom.

Since his retirement from Bell and for the following ten years, Denis stayed professionally active by accepting two mandates: management of real estate projects with a firm involved in retirement homes across Canada, then project management with another firm providing outside plant engineering services to the Bell family.

As a volunteer, Denis has been involved over the last 30 years at all levels of the Kidney Foundation of Canada, serving as Chapter President (Québec City), then Division President (Québec), acting several years as a director on the national BOD, and eventually as National Treasurer for 4 years.

Denis has joined the BPG Board in October 2015 and is a member of the Governance and the Pension Committees. He was recommended as a BPG Director at Large at the 2016 Chapters' Annual General Meetings.
